<u>Subject: Maritime Cook Islands circular 150/2017 reg. BWM Convention Implementation.</u>

- Maritime Cook Islands has issued a Circular 150/2017 (copy attached) regarding the Ballast Water Management Implementation and instructions on decoupling the IOPP renewal date.
- BWM convention will come into force from 08th September 2017. By 08 September 2017, vessels to which Ballast Water Management Convention applies are required to:
 - 1. Have an Approved Ballast Water Management Plan on board,
 - 2. Maintain a Ballast water record book,
 - 3. Manage their ballast water on every voyage by performing ballast water exchange (or by approved ballast water treatment system as applicable),
 - 4. International Ballast Water Management Certificate.
- Existing ships are required to comply with requirement of Regulation D-2 (the ballast water performance standard) no later than the first IOPP renewal survey after 08 September 2017; till then vessels are required to comply with regulation D-1 (ballast water exchange) of the Convention.
- Ships with keel laying date after the 08 September 2017 are required to comply with regulation D-2 upon delivery.
- Administration has no objection to decouple the renewal survey of IOPP certificate prior to 08 September 2017.
- Ship owners intending to decouple the IOPP renewal survey are requested to notify administration in advance.
- However, administration has advised that re-harmonization of the IOPP certificate is to be done at earliest possible opportunity and not further than the next IOPP renewal survey.
- Ship owners/ operators and masters are advised to be guided by above
